MORE AFSSRN WEBINARS IN 2024



The second of a series of monthly AFSSRN Webinars on the theme, "Narrowing the Social Science and Fisheries Technology Divide," was held on 28 August 2024. The esteemed speaker, Dr. Abdul Halim, Country Representative of

the Environmental Defense Fund, Indonesia Office talked on how the e-logbook technology facilitates regular data collection on blue swimming crabs. He discussed on how small-scale fishers in Lampung Province, Indonesia are motivated to voluntarily report catches regular. He highlighted how social science analysis helps decision makers understand behavioral changes towards increased likelihood of e-logbook adoption.



The third webinar happened on 25 September 2024. Ms. Jee Grace B. Suyo-Diala, a faculty of the College of Management, University of the Philippines Visayas, talked on the role of social science networks in the advancement of the Philippine

seaweed industry. Having done several seaweed-related research, Ms Suyo-Diala discussed how the social networks and power relations among seaweed value chain actors influence the seaweed industry. She discussed the importantly the social and gender lens can reveal sustainability indicators that might be otherwise overlooked.



The fourth webinar featured a Malaysian perspective on integrating technology, nature and community towards enhancing climate resilience and sustainability in coastal communities. Dr. Natrah Ikhsan,

a faculty of the College of Agriculture, Universiti Putra Malaysia, discussed how the use of advanced technologies for environmental monitoring and educational platforms. She also described how coastal communities can benefit from the Integrated Multi-Trophic Aquaculture (IMTA) for healthier ecosystems that ensure sustainability of coastal aquaculture practices and livelihood opportunities.
